

Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Clean Harbors will accept for transportation and disposal the majority of hazardous waste typically produced by households. It is stressed for the safety of everyone involved that all the materials are known and properly labeled. Wastes that are not in their original containers can be accepted as "known" wastes provided they are labeled. Unknown wastes, if accepted, will be field tested and packaged for incineration.

What To Bring

Unneeded household hazardous waste in sealed containers, for example (use original containers when possible):

Drain cleaners
Oven cleaners
Metal polish
Photo chemicals
Floor cleaners
Arts and crafts supplies
Dry cleaning fluids
Radiator cleaners
Rust preventatives
Wood preservatives
Wood strippers
Oil based paint
Paint thinner
Solvents
Sealants
Pesticides
Rodent killers
Pool chemicals
Muriatic acid
Antifreeze
Herbicides
Insect sprays
Brake fluid
Transmission fluid
Engine and radiator flushes
Old chemistry sets
Creosote
Cesspool Cleaners
Moth balls
Bleaches
Ammonia

To Ensure Safety, Please:

- Tighten caps and lids leaving materials in original labeled containers.
- Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper.
- Sort and pack separately: paint, pesticides, household cleaners.
- **NEVER MIX CHEMICALS!**
- Pack your vehicle and go directly to the site. **NEVER SMOKE** while handling hazardous materials.
- Do not place waste in a garbage bag.

Kids, never touch hazardous materials. Ask your parents to package these products.

What NOT To Bring

Clean Harbors reserves the right to refuse any waste deemed unsafe to handle or dispose of for the collection. Such wastes include:

- Large quantities of unknown materials
- Radioactive waste, including smoke detectors
- Explosives, gun powder, flares, ammunition
- Unstable wastes
- Pressurized fire extinguishers
- Unknown gas cylinders
- Substances regulated by the Drug Enforcement Agency
- Medical or Biologically Infectious Waste Materials
- All Batteries
- Electronic Waste
