## CITY OF KIMBALL STREET SNOW

### REMOVAL PLAN

The City of Kimball's average snowfall is 36 inches annually. Because of the high cost of labor & equipment, the City cannot economically justify removing all snowfall accumulations from every street in the city. The following priorities outline the established degree of snow control to be expected for streets in that priority level:

- #1: All main arterials considered to be the minimum network which must be kept open to provide a transportation system in connecting hospital, fire, police, and emergency rescue squads
- #2: Downtown business district, schools, bus routes and major arterial roads.
- #3: Secondary priority routes and alternate truck route (State Street). North side streets (North Street & East Main Street)
- #4. All remaining streets such as residential and local roads.

Except for very severe conditions, all priority 1, 2, 3 streets will be kept open and maintained. Priority 4 streets will not receive regular winter maintenance. If snow completely blocks traffic, the streets will be plowed when crews are available. Equipment will be provided to respond to emergency situations.

We would like to remind citizens that the placing, dumping or pushing of snow onto City streets or right of ways from adjacent properties is prohibited by city ordinance.
